

## Code of Conduct

Read and fully understand the guidelines on do's and don'ts during the assessment process.

- You will be under the surveillance of an Artificial Intelligence driven assessment environment with a unique cheating prevention mechanism. Committing to any kind of malpractice can have very serious consequences on your result for qualification to further process, you could lose all the marks in the assessment unit or be disqualified from further opportunities through MyAnatomy.
- Entire duration of your assessment will be monitored through webcam monitoring with eye ball tracking and face recognition system, Window proctoring, plagiarism check and live tracking of your answers/ responses during the test.
- Impersonating other candidates or your self during the examination will ban the candidature of both the involved entities from further events like – Job, Internship, coding challenges, Hackathons, scholarship programs and all other on and off campus opportunities through MyAnatomy.
- Do not carry any unauthorized material like notes, study guides, mobile phones calculators, tablets and other gadgets or reference material during examination.
- Do not try to communicate with other candidates verbally or through gestures during the examination.
- Try to avoid any individual/group coming into the webcam monitored area and do not move away from the webcam during the examination failing in any or both the scenarios will be considered as a suspicious activity.
- Using objectionable, abusive or offensive language in the answer sections or trying to write/communicate to award qualifying marks is strictly not allowed and necessary disciplinary actions will be taken.
- Sharing Information using social media platforms – Understand that all the questions and content shown during the assessment is the sole property of the administering entities. Hence, misusing, misguiding, sharing or attempting to share the information which could be assessment related will result in serious consequences.
- Understand plagiarism- Plagiarism involves taking someone else's work, thoughts or ideas and presenting them as your own. As well as copying from published texts in print or on the internet, plagiarism can refer to essays, pieces of work previously submitted for assessment by others. It is a form of cheating which is taken very seriously.
